Introduction

- The Lanterman Developmental Disabilities Services Act ("The Lanterman Act"), was amended June 2012 to address POS disparity
- On March 31, 2013, regional centers first were required to post Purchase of Services (POS) Disparity Data on website
- Now the POS Disparity Data is posted by December 31 of each year
- Regional centers are required to hold public meetings and receive community input regarding the Disparity Data by March 31

Timeline

- Data represents authorizations/expenditures between July 2014 - June 2015 (FY 2014/15)
- Public input meetings by March 2016
- Written report to the Department of Developmental Services (DDS)
 - ✓ Outreach efforts
 - ✓ Input from the community
 - ✓ Outline plan of action
- Annual posting of data December
 - Reflects changes that were implemented in prior years
 - ✓ It could take approximately two years to see change in the data

Meeting Purpose

For the purpose of our meeting, we are going to focus on three primary areas:

- Total Annual Authorized Services and Expenditures by Ethnicity or Race
- Total Annual Authorized Services and Expenditures by Language
- Clients with No Purchase of Services by Ethnicity or Race or by Language


Meeting Purpose

- Obtain input from clients and families to understand potential reasons for POS disparity in authorizations and utilization (expenditures)
- Identify what we can do better to meet the needs of clients and their families that will result in more equality or equity:
 - ✓ In the authorization of services
 - Utilization of purchased services

Current Changes


- Input in 2015 informed SG/PRC on how to improve service delivery, access to services and utilization
 - Approve respite authorizations from monthly to 90 day authorizations
 - ✓ When needed, support exceptions for LVN respite from 30 to 32 hours (due to 4 or 8 hour utilization blocks of time)
 - Service coordinators and their managers will receive quarterly utilization reports



Facts - By Ethnicity






Clients by Ethnicity







Per Capita expenditures across all ethnic groups for consumers over the age of 22 years living at home,

averaged \$7,720 compared to all average for all age groups of \$5,472.


Hispanic consumers 22 years and older had approximately \$1,300 less authorized and \$1000 less utilized in POS expenditures than white consumers 22 years and older. Although Hispanic consumers were authorized less than all other ethnic groups, the utilization was also lower than the other three major groups.



What are the Trends

- Data reflects slight improvement in authorized and utilized services year over year
- Data continues to reflect per capita expenditures differences between different ethnic groups
- About 3% more of Asian and Hispanic consumers received POS in FY 2015 compared to FY 2014
- Consumers from the Filipino ethnic group most frequently did not have POS in FY 2015 at 27%, with Hispanic consumers at 25%

What are the Trends

- On a per person basis, Early Start (birth through 2 years) had the lowest POS authorized (\$6,550) and expenditures (\$4,492), with the lowest utilization rate of 69% of all age groups
- On a per person basis, consumers 22 years and older had the highest authorizations (\$21,241) and expenditures (\$19,456) and the highest utilization rate of 92%

What are the Trends

- Consumers living at home with their parents had the lowest per person authorization (\$7,434) and expenditure (\$5,550), with the lowest utilization rate of 75% compared to all other living arrangements
- Consumers living in community care facilities (CCFs) had the highest per person authorization (\$54,204) and highest expenditures (\$51,898), as well as the greatest utilization rate of 96%
