8/26/2020 Zoom Open Public Meeting to Discuss SG/PRC FY18-19 POS Expenditure Data and Review Equity Projects

Number of Participants: 39 total participants, including the following: representative from the Office of Clients' Rights Advocacy, SG/PRC Primary Liaison from DDS and two other Community Members; seven parents served by SG/PRC; six service providers; and 23 members of SG/PRC staff, including the presenter.

"Location" of Meeting: Zoom meeting

Translation Provided: The presentation was in English with simultaneous translation made available in Spanish.

Materials Provided: The complete Power Point Presentation was accessible from the materials link of the Zoom meeting announcement.

Meeting Summary: The meeting started shortly after 10:00 a.m. At the beginning of the meeting and periodically in the first few minutes, the participants were asked to sign into the chat function, indicating if they were a parent, vendor, community member or SG/PRC staff. Participants were also told that they could ask questions through the chat function during the presentation and that we would answer those questions at the end of the presentation.

SG/PRC briefly showed the audience what the standard "disparity data" reports looked like and where they could be found on the SG/PRC website. Then SG/PRC shared a Prezi presentation of SG/PRC's equity projects funded by DDS, which had been inspired by parent comments from previous community meetings. This presentation showed photos and images of people and events associated with SG/PRC's equity projects – both current and previously funded projects that are ongoing -- including Parent Mentor Initiative (PMI), Navigating the Regional Center System (NRCS) workshops, development of on-line webinars for parents, ADEPT ABA on-line modules, "Understanding My Child's Disability" on-line modules, and Community Outreach Specialist activities that included participation in LA County Library Outreach Workshops, connection with various Asian community groups, and recruitment of pediatricians/physicians to learn more about the regional center and early identification of children with developmental delays.

The Prezi portion of the presentation was followed by a Power Point Presentation of the Purchase of Services (POS) Authorizations, Expenditures, and Utilization reports for FY 18-19. These reports were presented with bar graphs and pie charts to help make the information more understandable. Specific improvements, such as seen in FY18-19 in Early Start POS services for African-Americans were noted, as well as the continuing trend of disparities in POS Authorizations that lead to lower expenditures for Hispanic school-aged and adults. However, Early Start authorizations and expenditures for Hispanic babies were higher than any other

group. The lowest Early Start authorizations and expenditures were found in the White group. The influence of language on expenditures was also discussed, including a more detailed breakdown by type of Asian language. Those whose primary language is Vietnamese and Mandarin were shown to have lower utilization, usually attributed to a lack or limited number of direct service providers with those language proficiencies.

Participants were notified that DDS would not be accepting new applications for grants to increase equity until the end of the year for the current Fiscal Year 19-20. However, now was the time to offer suggestions for new projects. Parents were also notified that SG/PRC intends to apply for continuation grants for PMI and NRCS, as well as development of additional on-line learning modules helpful to parents.

Parents were encouraged to let SG/PRC know what else we should be doing to help increase equity. Participants were told that they could send information to Carol Tomblin following this presentation, if they had ideas they wanted to share.

Community Comments: There were no specific suggestions for new projects. In general, there were comments that parents who had participated in PMI and/or NRCS found those projects very helpful in increasing their understanding of regional center services and helping them obtain the services needed for their family members. There were suggestions about working with the schools and having a closer working relationship with the cities. Please see below.

One parent wrote later to ctomblin@sgprc.org: "That was a wealth of information and a great presentation. I am sure everyone appreciated the information as did I. Maybe you can send out a Survey that could capture some additional information you are seeking from the community."
