LEGISLATIVE ISSUES & OTHER INFORMATION

Joe Alvarez, Interim Executive Director, and staff reported the following:

- SB 188, Trailer Bill Language the following are some of changes made:
 - The Family Cost Participation Program and The Annual Family Program Fee are suspended through June 2023.
 - The first provider rate increase will start 6 months early (January 2023). The second and final one will begin a year early (July 2024). The funds shall mostly go to DSPs.
 - Regional centers and school districts will have liaisons in Early Intervention.
 - The Early Start caseloads will be reduced, IFSP review to be done quarterly.
 - o Tailored Day Services will be greatly expanded. Provider rates specifically set.
 - o Alternative Nonresidential Services can continue to the end of 2022.
 - Financial management services' cost may be paid by the RC for those in SDP.
 - o Enhanced service coordination for 0-5-year-olds, zero/low POS (1:40 caseload
 - o The bill creates a Coordinated Family Support Services Pilot Program.

- o There may be a significant overhaul of the fair hearings process
- Social Connections Workshop Series This is an 8-Week Workshop Series Focused on Building Community and Friendships for Individuals Served by the Regional Center.
- COVID -19- Numbers are climbing once again. July has the highest numbers since the last surge in January (2022). SG/PRC continues to serve as testing at our Center. Staff continue to provide PPE. If LA County remains in highest level, it may trigger a County mandated mask mandate around July 29th. Currently, 15% of staff are onsite with 85% of staff working remotely.
