



The Department of Developmental Services awarded San Gabriel /Pomona Regional Center the following projects as part of the Community Resource Development Plan for Fiscal Year 2022-2023:

Affordable Housing

SG/PRC was awarded \$1,000,000 to secure five (5) one-bedroom units for adults served by SG/PRC, at a cost of \$200,000 per unit. SG/PRC tenants would pay 30 percent of SSI for monthly rent (all tenant utilities included in monthly rent payment), which equates to \$252 per monthly for a one-bedroom unit. SG/PRC will provide all services for any adult served by SG/PRC, who is living at the Prisma Artist Loft community, located in Pomona, CA. All residents living at Prisma will have access to supportive services, provided by National CORE's sister non-profit, the Hope through Housing Foundation (HTHF). HTHF is dedicated to breaking the cycle of generational poverty and building social equity by implementing programs that empower individuals and change communities by delivering outcomes-based programs and services to low-income residents.

Licensed Adult Day Program

SG/PRC was awarded \$200,000 to develop a licensed Day Program that can meet the needs of individuals who have self-care deficits and nursing needs, including medication management. This program is to be located in our central or eastern portion of our catchment area. This program would have a LVN to provide medical care services which may require the development of a health care plan. In addition, a RN Consultant would be needed to provide training to staff and who would also be responsible for the preparation of needed health care plans. The capacity would be 30, with a minimum of 10 non-ambulatory capacity. The program will also require a development of a transportation component.

Enhanced Behavioral Support Home (EBSH) for Children

SG/PRC was awarded \$750,000 for the acquisition and rehab of a home needed to develop an Enhanced Behavioral Support Home (EBSH) for Children. Currently, there is a need to provide specialized residential services to children with significant behavioral challenges, and who are in large temporary housing facilities that are overseen by the Department of Children and Family Services. This EBSH will serve as a permanent home for these children and provide specialized services that each child would need. Trauma Informed Care (TIC) and behavioral intervention by a BCBA are two such services.

Enhanced Behavioral Support Home (EBSH) for Adults

SG/PRC was awarded \$750,000 for the acquisition and rehab of a home needed to develop an Enhanced Behavioral Support Home (EBSH) for adults. Currently, there is a need to provide specialized residential services to adults with a forensic background and who have significant behavioral challenges. These individuals may have been incarcerated at the county, city or state level. Offenses, though, cannot include sexual abuse to children (Pedophilia).

Dental Project for Children / Interceptive Orthodontics

SG/PRC was awarded \$264,000 for a dental project that will involve interceptive orthodontics to improve a child's quality of life earlier in the developmental stages (age 5 through 8). This is a joint project with Frank D. Lanterman Regional Center. Currently, Denti-Cal does not cover interceptive early diagnosed orthodontic treatment, which would avoid the most severe restricted surgical intervention in the future. The project would include 20 children that would be followed for three years, funding for the interceptive orthodontic treatment through the grant and collaborating with their current OT/ Speech Pathologist, BCBA, and the Dental Desensitization Skill Building Program (DDSBP) in SG/PRC's mock clinic. The goal in phase one is to show improvement in jaw development and teeth alignment.
